Annual Town Hall Meeting ("THM") Monday, March 18, 5:00 pm, Laurel Nokomis School

Now in 2024, although the Venetian Is older, the reality is our community (and Venice) is still growing and there is plenty of new information that all residents want and need to know. Laurel Road Widening Update

No great progress to report but still moving ahead. The last few Laurel Road meetings were related to the right-of-way (title, appraisals, processes). Sarasota County has also received the Laurel Road widening state funding agreement for construction. The County official in charge of roads and transportation will be speaking at the Town Hall Meeting. Although we have heard the vocal concerns about roundabouts, don't be surprised if you hear that the only viable option is a roundabout at the intersection. It may come down to that becoming the final decision, which will cause you to consider whether that option is better than nothing at the intersection.

- Have you been down to the Venice Farmer Market on the island? It is open from 8 am to 1 pm on Saturdays. Local vendors, fresh goods and lots of people, many with their dogs. An upbeat event.
- There have been some changes in the Flood Zone Map for Sarasota County. To see your flood zone and determine if there are any changes, go to www.vgrcca.org where the new map is posted.
- If you drive into the new Vistera complex off of Laurel Rd, you will see the enormity of this property. More on this and other housing developments at the upcoming Town Hall Meeting on Monday, March 18th.
- Venice Blues Festival at the Airport will be held March 22nd from 4 pm to 10 pm, and on Saturday, March 23rd, from 11 am to 10 pm. Guest artists include Average White Band, Robert "Lefty Preacher" Sampson and Vince Johnson as well as the Plantation Allstars ...for Blues Fans these are just household words.
- Car lovers, get to the free 34th Annual Car Show at Centennial Park (downtown Venice) from 8 am to 3 pm on Sunday, March 24th.
- The Northeast Venice Park design on Laurel is underway and moving through the permitting and approval processes. Construction is anticipated to start in the fall of 2024. This topic may be addressed at the Town Hall Meeting.
- Sarasota County voters will determine this November whether to again extend an optional local property tax for the School District after the School Board unanimously approved a recent resolution to continue a referendum on the issue.

Shredfest

To show you how successful the 2024 Shredfest/Junkfest was, the Community Association has already booked the Shredding company for 2025. This year's event saw an estimated 140 cars drive through in a two-hour period. In terms of shredding, the company took in 26 bins which equates to 6,000-6,500 pounds. As to the junk part of the fest, the City Public Works team collected 6 yards of cardboard, a 20-yard roll-off full of metal and a total weight slip of 1.91 tons. A team of approximately 12 resident volunteers helped throughout the event. This year there were not as many interesting junked items as last year although one of the volunteers noticed that hubby junked his wife's golf clubs. Whether the Mrs. knew was not determined but certainly will when she is ready to head to the golf course for a 9:35 am tee time. The Community Association thanks all those who participated in this year's super event and we hope to see you next year.

Move Over

Just giving drivers a heads up about a proposed bill that would take effect in January 2025, assuming that the Governor signs it. Under the law, if two or more lanes of traffic are moving in the same direction and the posted speed is at least 65 mph, motorists can only use the left land to overtake and pass another vehicle or when preparing to exit the road, street or highway when otherwise directed by an official traffic control device. Violation fine up to \$158.00.

Unsightly?

In the February edition of Parcels, there was a news story about the new Mosquito Management Facility on Honore. On February 1st, the Community Association alerted our County Commissioner regarding the outside look of corrugated metal. This structure is visibly seen by those coming off the expressway and sure doesn't give a positive look for the gateway to North Venice.

PUTTING THINGS IN PERSPECTIVE

The majority of our residents moved to the VGRC probably not knowing anyone and took the social route to make new friends. With this as a background, there has been one thing that Parcels has noticed that has resulted from this social interaction. Unfortunately, residents suffer losses, debilitating conditions or severe injuries. What has been noticed is that friends and neighbors provide great support to those who face these unfortunate circumstances.....they bring food, they assist for a welfare check, they include them in social events and do what is necessary to assist the individual or family. We can as a community focus on all the headline issues about the shopping center, the Laurel Road widening or pickleball, but Parcels believes the real headline in this great community which we have chosen to live is the compassion residents continually provide to other residents in time of need.



A VERY INFORMATIVE PRESENTATION

Three members of the Venetian Community Association joined close to 100 residents who attended the subject talk at the Venice Community Center on Land Development in Venice conducted by City Planning Director Roger Clark. Here is their report...

The talk was open to all and designed to educate the public about the process for evaluating and approving land and building development projects. Other members of the Planning Commission and some members of the City Council were present and were acknowledged, but only Mr. Clark spoke. He proved to be an engaging speaker with vast knowledge and experience on this topic, borne of his 20+ years' service with the city.

Mr. Clark first provided some basic statistics on how rapid growth has been in Florida and in Venice over the past 50 years, with particular emphasis on the last 10 years. The population of Venice has already surpassed projections for 2030 made several years ago. He spent the bulk of the hour outlining the steps the city follows before approving any application. It was of interest to note that builders/developers are assessed a significant "mobility fee" (on the order of \$5,000 per typical home). The substantial revenue from these fees partially (but not fully) offsets the impact of new development on the need for improved roads. Although not a stated goal of the session, it was clear to this attendee that Mr. Clark wanted the public to understand city employees and Town Council representatives are not free to rule for or against a particular project based on their personal opinions or even according to pressure from members of the public. This is supported by the following sentence from the city's website: "The decision [to approve or deny] must be supported by competent substantial evidence and, therefore, the personal opinions of the decision maker or the public related to the project are irrelevant".

We are all aware of and concerned about what many view as over-development, especially in North Venice. With time and sustained effort, comprehensive plans and zoning regulations can be changed, but must still meet state requirements, which are often favorable to development. Opposition to specific projects, however, will not likely be successful if the developer is meeting all current requirements.


