Helping Out Your Community in a Patriotic Way

April showers bring May flowers is thought to be the reason in 1868 General John Logan, 3rd Commander in Chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, ordered May 30th as a day of remembrance for those who died serving in the Civil War. Establishing a day of remembrance at the end of May would ensure enough flowers would be in bloom that could be used to decorate the graves of the Civil War dead.



After World War I, this annual day of remembrance, known as Decoration Day, evolved to include all those service members who died fighting for our country. As the years progressed, Decoration Day was also referred to as Memorial Day. In 1967, Congress officially changed the name from Decoration Day to Memorial Day. Shortly thereafter in 1971, Congress designated the last Monday in May as Memorial Day to honor all who have died defending our country.

This year the Venetian Community Association will again observe Memorial Day by lining our community entrance and the River Club traffic circle with the Stars and Stripes. Those wishing to volunteer placing flags should meet at the old Welcome Center parking lot at 8:30 am on Friday, May 24th. Looking forward to seeing you there.

Qualifying week for the 2024 election runs from noon, Aug. 19 to noon, Aug. 23, so there is time for other candidates to file for either Seats 3 or 4. There is no primary race, so the candidate with the most votes will win the seat, even if they have less than 50% of the vote plus one. This last happened in 2019, when Ron Feinsod won a three-way race for mayor with 40.1% of the vote. Currently council members serve as many as three consecutive three-year terms and then must take a one-year hiatus before serving again.
