Annual Candidate Forum

The Forum will feature two races: one for Venice City Council, the other for our CDD. The Forum schedule is as follows:

- Venice City Council Seat 3 at 10:00 am
- Venice City Council Seat 4 at 11:00 am
- Venetian CDD Seat 3 at 1:00 pm
- Venetian CDD Seat 5 at 2:00 pm

As you can see, we have divided up the races by time. Therefore, you can choose which sessions you desire to attend. Once a session begins, we ask that audience members do not enter the dining room area. As you will note, there will be an appropriate break between sessions. Over the years, we have used various formats for this event. The one that appears to work well is where we focus on the key issues that the candidate will face if elected. We provide the same question to each candidate. Questions are provided by a moderator. If you have a suggestion for a question that will be given to both candidates, please send it to vgrcca@gmail no later than Wednesday, September 18th. Please put in the subject matter "Question for Candidate Forum". A small team from the Community Association will consider all suggested questions and develop the final version.

Remembering 9/11

We must never forget as we enter this month, the tragic September 11th, 2001, event where airplanes under the control of Al Qaeda terrorists crashed two airplanes into the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in NYC, one airplane struck the Pentagon in Washington, DC and a fourth plane crashed in rural Pennsylvania during a passenger revolt. In total, almost 3,000 people were killed in the 9/11 terrorist attacks. Many recall where they were when news came out about the terrorist activity. In Venice's Patriots Park, just past the north bridge near the bypass, there stands a 2-ton steel beam from the World Trade Center wreckage on 9/11 and a piece of rubble from the attack on the Pentagon. May we never forget this horrible event in our history.

Know your Snakes!

We asked the outstanding resident who volunteers his time to keeping the Boardwalk in tiptop shape to tell us more about snakes that one may encounter on property. It's worth your
time to go to YouTube TV and view "Top 6 venomous snakes in Florida" -- 3 of which
can be found right here in our community. **Of the many snakes around our**community, most are harmless but the 3 to keep an eye out for are pygmy
rattlers, diamondbacks and cottonmouths. Being able to identify venomous
snakes is important for the safety of you, your family and pets. The venom from the
majority of rattlesnake bites and other venomous snakes will damage tissue and affect your
by destroying skin tissues and blood cells and by causing you to hemorrhage internally. If tagged by a venomous snake,
seek immediate medical attention but do not panic or run which will only spread the venom through your bloodstream faster.
When you seek medical attention, you will probably be asked if you can identify the snake so as to better treat the bite and
administer the appropriate anti-venom.

- Pygmy rattlers are generally not life-threatening to adults, but their bite can be very painful and cause serious injuries to children and small pets.
- Diamondbacks are the largest, most dangerous and most feared venomous Florida snake. A 6-foot diamondback can strike from a distance of 4 feet. A bite untreated can lead to organ failure and death.
- Cottonmouths, also known as water moccasins, are venomous pit vipers with a bite that is dangerous and potentially fatal.

Pygmy rattlers and diamondbacks have been spotted around our community and boardwalk. Cottonmouths have been spotted in and near the river, but river flood water can bring them inland. Rattle snakes will normally give a rattle to warn you when getting too close but if you are wearing ear buds you might not hear the warning. Keep your dog on a leash so you can pull your dog away from any snakes (many times dogs will attack a snake not knowing the danger). You can click on www.vgrcca.org or even use the QR code to see pictures of the above snakes to possibly download on your own phone.

The Game from the Press Box

In about all high school, college and pro football games, assistant coaches sit in the press box looking down on the field in order to get a different perspective of the game. They send information often to sideline coaches to aid in defensive and offensive strategy. The following article is from the perspective of looking at a certain situation from above.

For a moment, step back from all the controversy regarding land use and the role developers play in northeast Venice and focus for a moment on the many household dwellings which have been built or are on schedule to be built in northeast Venice. We have included at the end of Parcels an eye-opening map of the area that was distributed to residents attending the 2024 Community Association's Town Hall Meeting. Although we all have our opinions of developers, one thing we do know about their strategy is that they will attempt to build in an area where individuals or families will rent or buy. They come; we build. That business principle is surely self-evident in northeast Venice. Think about it...if you were planning to move to Florida, northeast Venice is a wonderful, quality of life site with its proximity to a variety of cultural opportunities, recreational sites including a new park, top rate medical services including an award-winning hospital, inviting climate most of the year, no state taxes, beaches in close proximity, all of which are located in an area basically free of many of the ills of an urban area. Trailing right behind the moving vans are businesses ready to serve the domestic migration. This area is especially ripe for business opportunities, especially retail, partially due to the income level of those renting or purchasing a home.

The challenges northeast Venice is facing are not geared to only this area. It is spreading to other cities like Ft. Myers and Naples and Sarasota's adjoining county of Manatee. The Herald recently ran a story that Manatee County has approved a housing community of 6,000 residences spreading across the county.

How "the game" will end is to be seen. Will there be an economic downturn as there was previously slowing down the building efforts? Will local officials listen to many of the community members to retard the growth? Will state legislators enact new laws and regulations to control this massive Florida building effort? Will the migration to the Sunshine State slow down? What is certain in the coming years for those in northeast Venice and Sarasota County is that the view from the "press box" as we know it today will most likely be quite different.
