Introducing a New Adult Learning Experience

Osher Lifelong Learning Institute ("OLLI") at Ringling College is part of a dynamic national network of 124 OLLI's funded partly by The Bernard Osher Foundation. They provide learning and social opportunities designed for people 50 and older. They offer year-round classes, lectures, workshops, and special events (Trivia, OLLI Breakfast Club, etc.). Their program is organized by semester (Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer). OLLI offers intellectually stimulating, non-credit courses and learning opportunities tailored to meet lifelong learners' diverse interests and needs. OLLI is a membership-based organization with two levels of membership. OLLI has been affiliated with Ringling College since 2017. In 2016 The Lifelong Learning Academy (formerly Senior Academy) merged with Ringling College of Art and Design and became the Ringling College Lifelong Learning Academy (RCLLA). OLLI offers classes Monday – Friday from 9:00 am – 3:30 pm. Courses, lectures, and workshops are offered at Sarasota Art Museum (the old Sarasota Public High School). The subject areas are many. Northeast Park Update

- The County gave final approval for funding the new NE Venice park on 11/21 (using park impact fees), so all the plans in the latest proposal will be included. This means there will be 8 pickleball courts, court rest areas, upgraded restrooms and artificial turf for the dog park area (saving a lot in maintenance).
- Lighting for the courts is NOT included. It would add \$400-500K in cost due to added security features which have to be part of lighting in a park. it could be added later.
- They are now proceeding with the final contractor planning.
- It is estimated that groundbreaking would occur in late January or early February 2025, with completion in 6-8 months.

You Ever Wonder?

With three bridges leading to the island of Venice, what happens if the police or fire department need to respond to a call when taking one of the bridges is the fastest route to the emergency.....and the bridge is up? So, we asked both the Venice Police Department and Fire Department this question. Here's their answers:



Police Response

An officer's response when they find a bridge in the up position and blocking their path will depend on the specific circumstances at the time. In some cases, it may be advisable to re-route to another bridge, as only one can be open at a time. In other instances, it might be reasonable to wait until the bridge lowers. In serious emergency situations, officers would likely be responding from multiple directions. If one officer observes that a bridge is opening, they would communicate this information over the radio, allowing other units to adjust their routes accordingly. We successfully navigate this issue on a regular basis.

Fire Response

Whenever a station is dispatched to a location in which a bridge must be crossed, dispatch automatically calls the bridge tender to notify our response. Further, crews will advise dispatch which bridge they will be crossing and an estimated timeframe of crossing when they are transporting a patient. In the very rare chance crews encounter a raised bridge during their response, they will notify all other units to take a different route or have dispatch call the bridge tender to lower the bridge immediately.
