

We learned ways to avoid conflict with animals by securing our garbage cans and not putting them out too early. We learned that by soaking a tennis ball in apple cider vinegar and putting it in the attic, raccoons will be deterred from moving in! Raccoons are very smart, adaptable to their environment, and very vocal. Raccoons will sometimes be seen during the daytime which does not necessarily mean that they have rabies. Only a blood test can determine that.
