HRT UPDATES

HRT: PLEASE "CHECK ON ME" PROGRAM

The HRT (Hurricane Response Team) is offering an additional service this year under the "Check On Me" program. We understand that a hurricane can be a frightening experience and for your peace of mind (and that of your families), you may wish to have someone ring your doorbell and check on you and your family after any storm that we



may experience. (Our HRT members will also have information such as phone numbers that you might need to obtain for post-storm services).

To have a member of the team check on you and your family after a storm, you will need to register. Look for an email coming out soon that provides a link to an online form that provides our team with the necessary information to provide this service. This service is in addition to the service that we offer to our neighbors who have medical needs and are contacted before and after a hurricane.

New Center for Community Empowerment

The community outreach and after-school educational programs offered by Laurel Civic have outgrown their original location at the Sandra Sims Terry Community Center, with an ever-growing waiting list of families for its after-school tutoring program. Last month Laurel Civic Executive Director unveiled plans to build a new 70,000-square-foot "Center for Community Empowerment" and a \$50 million fundraising campaign to build it on four acres across from Laurel Nokomis School, on the property that is currently being cleared. Laurel Civic will be able to expand its adult and youth empowerment programs and welcome other nonprofits under its roof to create a community resource.



They're Back



Think of Jack Nicholson's famous line of "I'm Back" in the movie, The Shining. Well. Walmart has purchased 22 acres of land in the area that is being currently cleared across from Laurel Nokomis School. They're back. Walmart has a history with Venice, and the VGRC. Back in 2007-2008, there were plans to build a Walmart at the corner of Knights Trail and Laurel Rd. When the new Venetian residents heard the news, they banded together to fight the development. And with the process of addressing the issue, the Venetian Golf and River Club Community Association was born, focusing at that time on "outside the gate" activity. The Venetian team

met directly with the developer to resolve the issue rather than going the judicial route. Walmart and the developer eventually bowed out of their interest in the location.

Besides the Walmart initiative, over the years the CA successfully lobbied for the extension of Jacaranda Blvd, lobbied for the building of the Sarasota Memorial Hospital — Venice, addressed the noise issue from the industrial park to our north and also successfully lobbied for the landscaping project at the Laurel Rd. exit.

There is no timeline yet for the opening of the Walmart.

Parcels has also reported that a Panda Express will be built on this same property. And if you speak to those who know all, you might be hearing about a major big box hardware store and a well-known steakhouse on Laurel that is being cleared.

Upcoming Seminars & Events

The Community Association's Seminars & Events Committee has been very busy and making great progress on planning activities for this upcoming season. We started the season early with a special event held on July 8.
