

## **STAYING CURRENT**

#### Laurel Rd. Widening

Just waiting for a few "behind the scenes" action steps; such as, request for proposals and purchase of right of ways, before we see some earth moving on Laurel Rd. Look to late 2025 or early 2026 for some visible road action.

#### **Shopping Center**

There was some work recently on the lake seen immediately after you turn right on Jacaranda. This lake will ultimately be drained which is one of the first steps in the process in changing the land to one ready to house a new shopping center. There is no certain date on the actual clearing of property but the attention to the lake indicates clearing will happen soon.

#### **Northeast Park**

On schedule and ready to open in April 2026 or sooner. As indicated in a previous Parcels, the VGRC Community Association has adopted the park.

#### **Clearing across from Nokomis School**

Two things learned from a recent conversation with a city official: although it was reported that Walmart would be building on this location, they have not officially applied for a permit. In addition, and not reported in the last Parcels, a carwash will also be on property. Naturally there is concern with the shopping center being located across from Laurel Nokomis School. Both school and county officials (Laurel Road is a county, not city road) are getting an early start on how to best handle this situation.

#### **Border is Getting Busy**

There is future activity taking place on Border and Auburn Rd. A new housing community will be built on 40 acres of property along Auburn, north of the Fox Lea Farms. Also on Border Road, overlooking interstate 75, there will be a new storage facility. One thing you might notice about the growth in Venice is the number of storage facilities being built. One could speculate as to why the apparent need for additional storage facilities. Perhaps it can be attributed to those who downsize their northern homes when moving south and bring many of their cherished belongings including that Lazy Susan which was received at



your wedding in 1971 or the lamp shade that grandma gave you when you moved into your first house and finally, those 12 perfect attendance and honor roll plaques you received in high school. Trust Parcels..... ultimately you will emotionally be able to release your past which will allow you to reduce the need and cost of a storage facility.

#### **Laurel Road Landscape Project: Enhancing Beauty and Security**

(We asked CDD Board member Cheryl Terrana to write the following article elaborating on the landscape work on Laurel Rd.)

As you may have noticed, the Venetian CDD is beginning work on the landscaping along the Laurel Road border. Much of the existing landscaping is being replaced in preparation for new plantings. This project aims to restore areas damaged by recent hurricanes while enhancing the overall beauty of our community and creating a natural barrier for added security.

Over time, we've observed an increase in non-residents entering through the buffer area—often for activities like fishing. To address this, the CDD Landscape Committee and Board of Supervisors has worked with a landscape architect to design a landscape plan that will not only improve aesthetics but also act as a deterrent to unwanted entry. The new plantings will feature terracing with fire bush and cardboard palms, creating a dense, visually appealing barrier. The updated landscaping will also include vibrant, native plants such as Liriope, Ixora, ornamental grasses, as well as beautiful trees like Pink Tabebuia and Lacebark Elms. For homes closest to Laurel Road, where headlights and noise can be a nuisance, the terracing and plant density was designed to help reduce these disturbances. In some areas, you'll notice certain existing plantings marked with tape. These are healthy plants that will be trimmed and preserved as part of the final design. The funds for this project come from the hurricane assessment we collected previously, thus ensuring no additional cost to residents.

The landscaping work will start on the west side of the community (near the 9th hole of the golf course) and continue eastward, all the way to the Venice Myakka River Park at the very end of Laurel. In the park area, we'll be adding a row of cardboard palms to further discourage entry. Please note that this phase of the project does not include updates to the entry monuments. Our next project, focused on refreshing the community's entrance and surrounding areas, has already begun. This includes a design for the entrance, the three islands after the entrance, and the area along Veneto Drive. These changes will create a cohesive theme for the community and replace trees lost during the hurricanes. Additional landscaping updates will also be made to the large roundabout near the River Club and the River Club entrance. Together, these projects will enhance the beauty of our community and improve property values. We're excited to see these improvements unfold, and we thank you for your patience as we work to enhance our shared spaces.

Patriots Park includes a 2-ton steel beam from the World Trade Center wreckage on Sept. 11, 2001, and a piece of rubble from the attack on the Pentagon. 9:59 a.m. is the exact time the South Tower fell.

As part of Venice's Centennial celebrations, the Venice Museum is pleased to announce its newest seasonal exhibit: VENICE TURNS 100! which celebrates the City on the Gulf's Centennial. The exhibit, which opened on Tuesday, Sept. 2, 2025, offers a glimpse into Venice's transformation throughout the decades. See how the city has grown from a plan laid out by renowned city planner John Nolen to the thriving community it is today. The Venice Museum is located inside the historic Triangle Inn, listed in both the Venice Register of Historical Resources and the National Registers of Historic Places. The museum is open Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.; and the first and third Saturdays in October through April from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.

The Venice Performing Arts Center (VPAC), located on the campus of the Venice HS, is often mentioned as the home of the Venice Symphony, which begins its season on October10th.
