

My Vacation from Earth

On December 1st, the Community Association hosted American NASA astronaut and retired Navy Captain Sunita "Suni" Williams as our guest speaker. Suni's sincere personality and engaging stories about her life as an Astronaut were fascinating. Chosen by NASA in 1998, she has completed 3 space missions and spent over 608 days in space during her career. Suni also completed more than 62 hours of spacewalks, making her the leading U.S. female astronaut in this area.

On June 6th, 2024, what began as a brief eight-day trip evolved into a 286-day mission in space for Suni, who outlined both the physical effects and the emotional challenges of



Suni's professional experience includes collaborating with astronauts from Russia, Japan, and various international organizations. During their missions, these astronauts remain actively engaged in both technical projects and medical research, utilizing their time in space efficiently and productively.

Suni serves as a role model for people of all ages. Her thoughtfulness, engaging conversation and patience when taking photos and signing books were truly valued. We thank Suni for her continued service and look forward to her next adventure.

The Risks

It's great to have your little 12-year-old grandson, Jimmy, just begging you to let him drive grandpa's golf cart. As the caring grandpa that you are, you let little Jimmy sit behind the wheel while you sit next to him. However, if Jimmy, unfortunately, hits a car or more seriously, taps a pedestrian, the police are called and can, according to the VPD, issue a crash report. In addition, the insurance company now must deal with an unlicensed driver operating a golf cart and can obtain the police department's crash report. The best advice is to follow what the CDD has previously communicated to all residents that people under age 18 must have either a learner's permit or driver's license in order to drive a golf cart legally in the state of Florida. Anyone 18 or older must carry a government ID. We recognize it is tempting to let your under-age grandchildren drive your golf cart, but this is a matter of everyone's safety. Please ensure your guests are aware of Florida state law if they will be using your golf cart on Venetian's roads.

Lithium Batteries

We hear reports nationwide about lithium batteries often being associated with fires. In fact, the state of New York has a task force concentrating on lithium batteries. As many residents own golf carts with lithium batteries,

Parcels reached out to the Venice Fire Department for their advice on lithium batteries. See Lithium Battery Safety Sheet prepared by the Venice Fire Department at the end of Parcels.



One final note that has been previously urged by the Fire Department Chief... no matter the type of battery you own, if you plan to leave your home for an extended time or even overnight, unplug the battery cord from the outlet.

Finally, be sure your charger is plugged into a circuit with the necessary amperage capacity for the charger's requirement and extension cord is suitable for the amperage. Consult your electrician if you have questions about your set up.

LITHIUM BATTERY SAFETY SHEET Prepared by the Venice Fire Department

General Residential Guidance

HAZARD SUMMARY

- Lithium batteries contain flammable electrolyte and may enter thermal runaway if damaged, overcharged, exposed to heat, or improperly stored.
- Fire may produce intense heat, flammable vapors, and toxic fumes.
- Damaged batteries may leak corrosive electrolyte that can irritate skin, eyes, and respiratory tract.

ACCIDENTAL RELEASE / LEAK

- Evacuate the immediate area if smoke, popping, hissing, or unusual odor is detected.
- Do not handle a swollen, smoking, or burning battery.
- For leaking battery fluids: avoid contact; wear gloves and eye protection; ventilate area.
- Place damaged batteries in a non-combustible container and contact proper disposal services.

HANDLING

- Use only UL-certified batteries and UL-listed charging equipment to ensure compliance with recognized safety standards.
- Use only manufacturer-approved chargers and charging cables.
- Do not puncture, crush, disassemble, or expose batteries to water or extreme heat.
- Keep batteries away from children, pets, metal objects, and sources of ignition.

RESIDENTIAL INSTALL & OPERATIONAL BEST PRACTICES

- Charge batteries on a non-combustible surface in a wellventilated area.
- Keep the charging area free of combustibles and maintain clear space around chargers.
- Install a smoke detector near the charging/storage area.
- Avoid charging unattended unless device manufacturer explicitly permits it.
- Store batteries in a cool, dry location away from direct sunlight and heat sources.
- Keep spare or loose batteries in protective cases to prevent short circuits.

EMERGENCY ACTIONS

- If battery smokes, swells, or overheats: Stop using it immediately. Move people away from the area.
- If fire occurs: Evacuate and call 911. Do not attempt to move a burning battery.

Electrolyte contact: Rinse skin or eyes with water for 15+ minutes and seek medical
